### Colour Palette

**Yellow** represents the sun and all of its life-giving properties; it symbolises light, warmth, and energy in Rastafarian.

**Red** represents the blood of those who have suffered in the liberation, as well as the hardship and sacrifice endured by African descendants throughout history.

**Brown** emerges as a powerful addition, symbolising the rich earth heritage and diversity inherent in Africa, while also serving as a bridge connecting the festival to its afro-centric influences.
